

ATTENDANCE--CERTIFIED NURSE ASSISTANT PROGRAM

Any student who has missed more than 20 days, or 4 days of clinical work, will not be eligible for certification.

Consistent attendance is an important requirement for successful completion of the Health Occupations course. A student who expects to be certified as an Assistant to Nurses must recognize that it is his/her responsibility to attend class and make up work missed. Attitude toward classwork and attendance are a clear indication of future job performance. Employers will view poor attendance as an indication of poor reliability.

The Health Occupations instructor is available before and after school for make-up. Clinical make-up will be available on Saturdays.

It is the responsibility of the student to provide his/her own transportation.
